Table 2 Kawasaki disease: diagnostic criteria. KD may be diagnosed with fewer than 4 of these features if coronary artery abnormalities are detected

Criterion	Description
Fever	Duration of 5 days or more PLUS 4 of 5 of the following:
1. Conjunctivitis	Bilateral, bulbar, non-suppurative
2. Lymphadenopathy	Cervical, often >1.5 cm
3. Rash	Polymorphous, no vesicles or crusts
4. Changes in lips or oral mucosa	Red cracked lips; 'strawberry' tongue; or diffuse erythema of oropharynx
5. Changes of extremities	Initial stage: erythema and oedema of palms and soles Convalescent stage: peeling of skin from fingertips
